 - Fire Protection for Large Buildings

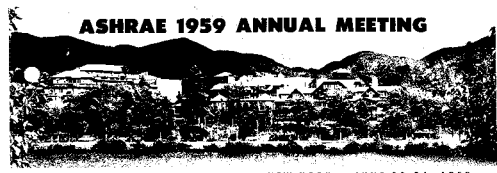
- Energy Requirements

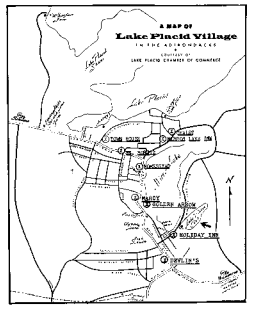
